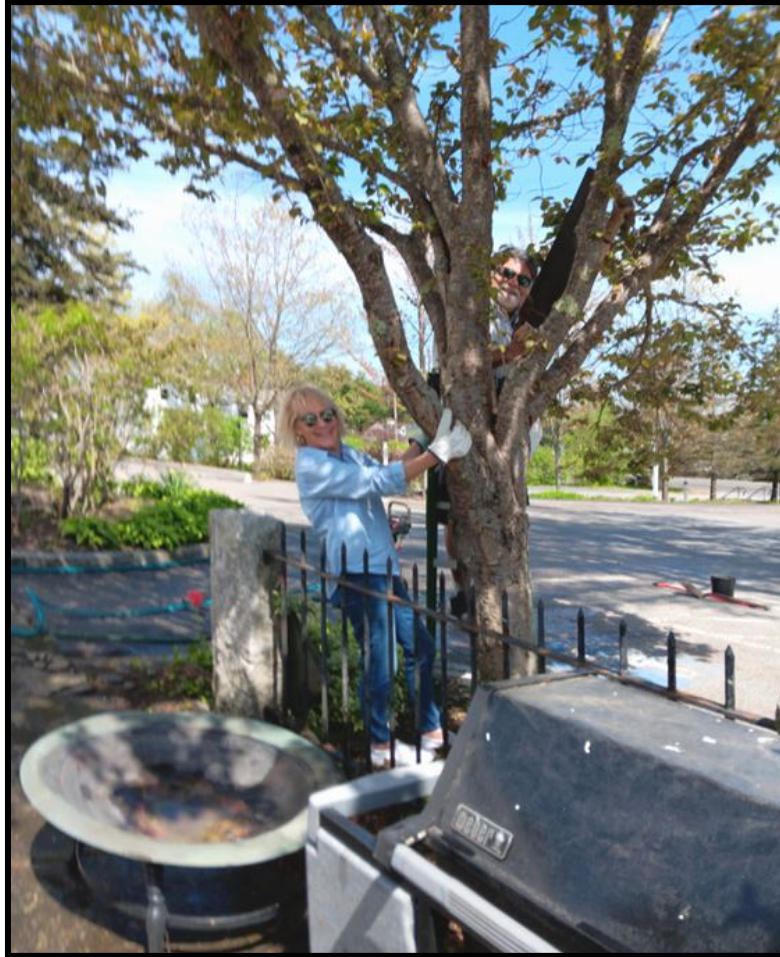

We look forward to seeing you all during this season of celebration!

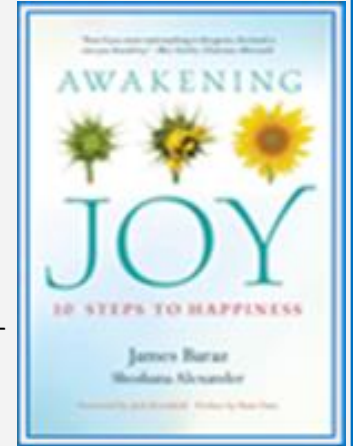

WELL-BEING IN THE MIDST OF IT ALL

The on-site morning mindfulness class will be continuing through the end of June on Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. in the parlor. We continue to welcome all participants. We will continue to focus on mindfulness practices to help us weather the storms of daily life and build resilience and maintain equanimity and a sense of well-being in the midst of all the troubling personal, national, and world events.

The class is loosely based on the book Awakening Joy, by James Baraz and Shoshana Alexander. It is “recommended,” but not “required” reading. Each hour-long session includes some teaching and a guided meditation. No previous meditation experience is necessary.

FCC Launches the Lewis Family Van Fundraising Effort



When Pastor Geoff left for sabbatical at the end of March, he charged those of us on the Governing Board with a “Neighbors in Need” project to pursue while he was away. It was all about a local family whose situation was quite dire and extremely compelling. We had discussed this family at a few board meetings and talked about what was happening, what their resources were, what the family was accessing for assistance, and what were unmet needs. We kept abreast through different contacts - Jill Fox, Catherine Hannon, and Pastor Geoff - as to the family’s status, which was changing, along with their ability to cope with daily challenges.

The need for a handicapped van became very clear and we chose this way to focus our energies.

If you are on this mailing list, you likely have received a letter in the mail, describing all of this and our goal to raise the money to purchase a (used) van that could accommodate a handicapped passenger. The price tag - which is our goal - is roughly \$80,000. And that is a no-frills previously owned option, but would serve them well.

Several weeks after launching the letter campaign, **we have realized over 45% of our goal** – thanks to Foreside Community members and friends! So, the energy is there, and we are closer to the finish line.

Vehicles equipped specifically for this type of situation will come on the market occasionally but be snatched up quickly. In order to buy the van, we need to have the cash on hand. We do have a great connection with Kurt (and Dorothy) Eckhardt to find such a vehicle. But first we need to raise the capital.

Thank you to everyone who has donated so far! We feel encouraged by your generosity and enthusiastic response.

In addition to the mail appeal, we are planning a **“One Pound or More Auction”** for our first fundraiser. If you were not able to attend the last one of these, let me tell you this is the MOST fun event ever. Our amazing duo of fabulous auctioneers (Lisa Nash and Carol Ward) have agreed to return to the stage for our entertainment. These two know how to put the FUN in FUNdraising. You will be so happy to come and participate.

It will be held on **Sunday, June 30**. That day also happens to be our last Sunday with our wonderful co-sabbatical ministers, Cheryl, and Sarah. Please bring your picnic lunch which will precede our auction. Bottles of cold water and cookies will be provided. Weather permitting, we will set up outdoors in the upper parking lot as we did before.

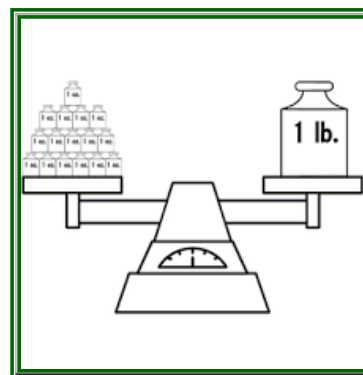
Please plan to join everyone on Sunday, June 30 immediately following worship. You will have a blast because this is one fun event...

2023 Bob Fuller Award Recipients

We celebrated two FCC members this year for this annual award. It was hard to realize how these two had not been recognized before this year.

The first recipient is Claudia Kinnear. Margaret Perkins shared beautiful reasons and descriptions (abridged below) of why Claudia is so deserving of this award.

Claudia joined the church in 1986 and she has been a member of the choir since that time. In the late 1990s-early 2002s Claudia and her husband, Bill, gave the upright piano that is currently in use in the sanctuary to the church to support the church's music program.

Because Claudia, aged 6, and her family were refugees in the aftermath of World War 2, the situation of others who are homeless, asylum seekers, and refugees resonates with her. She has been a walker and fund-raiser for Habitat for Humanity for more than 20 years, raising thousands of dollars each year for that cause.

For many years before the pandemic struck Claudia did the church coffee hour once a month. For Claudia, doing the coffee hour does not just mean showing up with a few plates of refreshments and making a pot of coffee. She begins preparations Thursday or Friday by inspecting the church kitchen and cleaning it to her standards. She sets the tables with plants and flowers from her garden. She arrives at the church by 8AM Sunday morning to be sure the coffee and hot water are properly made. She offers a gracious menu of items to please all age groups: crackers, cheese, cookies, and juice for the children; lovely tea sandwiches, pastries and her signature lemon squares, and fruit for the adult members. She takes great pleasure in seeing people enjoying extended conversations together with a snack and a cup of fortifying beverage.

Over the years she has been a steadfast friend to older church members, regularly visiting them at home, taking them flowers from her garden when they were no longer able to attend services and church activities.

She is a friend to all and has a cheery word for everyone. Claudia spends time daily calling church members who are ill and writing cards and messages remembering members' birthdays and special occasions.

Claudia! We cannot appreciate and thank you enough for all that you and Bill have given to Foreside Church over your many years of membership. You have truly been devoted to this ministry in so many ways. All of us who know and sing and worship with you, have benefited from your beautiful spirit and service.

We have the pleasure to announce that John Bischof is the co-recipient of the Bob Fuller Award for 2023.

So many reasons why John is deserving of this award. For one thing, John was a large part of the energy behind the "red hymnal" option to the black hymnal. Hymns of Truth and Light.

It may be safe to say he is a scholar of the scriptures. He must have spent hours in this pursuit. John loves digging into the philosophical or theological aspects of life.

He has a most generous heart and soul. If the call goes out in our congregation to prepare and deliver meals to someone who needs them, he will likely be the first to volunteer – often offering more than one dinner delivered. On a recent occasion, he delivered his homemade dinner on a serving tray! How gracious is that?

John Bischof is not only comfortable, but looks amazingly dapper, in a 3-piece suit. Yes, he wears it well – especially on Christmas Eve when he also sports a handsome overcoat and perfect fedora.

Yet if the call goes out to do churchyard cleanup after service, he looks just as natural in a canvas work shirt, jeans, and boots. And that is when you see the cross on the chain that he wears around his neck.

Contributions to our church life include being the host of the monthly Men's Breakfast. It is a rich part of our church life and very popular with attendance increasing. At Men's Breakfasts, when donations are given by those attending, they go to the Neighbors in Need Fund, rather

than to offset the expense of providing breakfast. This year, John encouraged the men attending on Saturday, to return to put on a coffee hour the next morning to honor Mother's Day.

John was tapped and agreed to deliver sermons during Janet Dorman's medical leave. And as July "Prayers on the Patio" has become a tradition, John can be counted on to fulfill a Sunday slot.

As a Minister of Worship, John approaches the worship service and his role with appropriate reverence. And can he deliver a scripture! His voice sounds as though it comes from Heaven itself. He is dedicated to serving on any Sunday, including Communion Sundays, Christmas Eve, Easter, and Pentecost...which John tells us is his favorite holy day.

As a minister of worship, on the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, he was asked to play the role of Martin Luther for Sunday service. John would have to dress the part as Martin Luther...and walk up to the front of the sanctuary ...and hammer the list of "protests against indulgences" into the door that was propped up for the occasion. He played the part seriously, yet unforgettably, as you might imagine.

Finally and quite to John's essence - you don't have to know him long to understand that he found and cherished the love of his life and misses her daily. There are beautiful flower arrangements in the sanctuary honoring all of the important dates in her memory, year after year that they are apart. I do wish I had known his beloved wife, Helen.

We are honored to present this award to you, John Bischof, dear friend, and member, with sincerest gratitude for your dedication and for all of your contributions over the years to our Foreside Community Church.

We love you and hope to enjoy many more years with you!

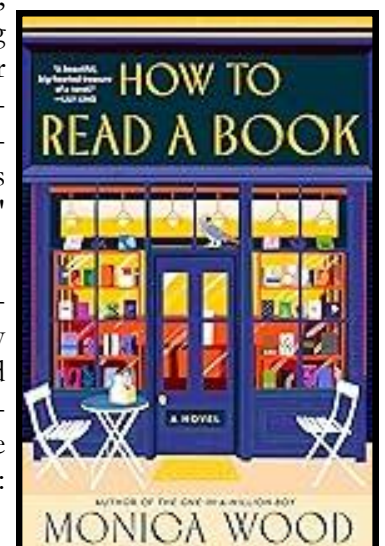

FRAUD RED FLAGS

Bath Savings has many safeguards in place to protect your personal information. Still, it is important to be vigilant as fraud and identity theft scams are becoming more sophisticated every day.

- A person calls or emails, pretending to be someone you trust, such as a family member or a representative from your bank and asks for personal information such as a social security number or password. The person may threaten legal action or using intimidation tactics to get you to respond.
- You're asked to send money through undetectable methods such as wire transfers and gift cards, or they may even send a check and ask you to return some of the money through these methods.
- A person calls/emails and claims that you have won a sweepstakes. They tell you to send them money to cover taxes or processing fees.
- You receive a phone call from someone claiming to work for Microsoft who indicates they've noticed dangerous software on your computer. In order to triage this, they are requesting remote access to your computer. This is a scam.
- Phishers want you to click a link that allows them to install malware on your device or try to access secure information. A common scenario is delivery-related scams, often in the form of text/email that claims you have a lost package you can retrieve by clicking a link.
- Romance scammers create fake profiles on dating sites and social media. The scammers strike up a relationship with you to build up trust, then, they make up a story and ask for money. If the person you're chatting with can't meet in person and asks you for money, it's probably a scam.

PROTECT YOURSELF

While Bath Savings proactively monitors all of our accounts for suspicious activity 24/7, it's important that you stay vigilant in protecting yourself from fraud.

- Read your credit reports. You have a right to a free credit report every 12 months from annualcreditreport.com or by calling 1-877-322-8228.
- Set up Account Alerts in online banking to receive notifications of activity on your account.
- Check your bank, credit card, and account statements for mistakes.
- Shred all documents that show personal, financial, and medical information.
- Don't respond to email, text, and phone messages that ask for personal information.
- Never click on links or open attachments from unknown sources, and never give anyone you don't know remote access to your computer.
- Create complex passwords that mix letters, numbers, and special characters. Don't use the same password for more than one account.
- When shopping online, use websites that protect your information with encryption. An encrypted site has "https" at the beginning of the web address.
- Never share multi-factor security codes such as the four to eight-character codes you get through text message or email.
- Use anti-virus and anti-spyware software, and a firewall on your computer. Set automatic updates.
- Never send money to strangers (via wire, PayPal, Zelle, etc.) under any circumstances.
