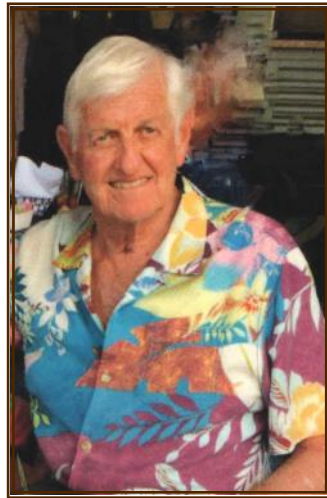

Green Team members Sue Clark, Janette Gustafson, Nancy Olmstead and Deb Reifsnnyder joined about sixty other members and friends of congregational earth care / climate action teams from around Southern Maine and beyond on Sunday afternoon, May 19.



The in-person gathering at Cape Elizabeth United Methodist Church was hosted by the BTS Center of Portland and offered an opportunity for spiritual nourishment, connection and exploration with people who are providing leadership for learning about the impacts of climate change, pursuing sustainable practices and embracing ecological understandings. About a dozen faith communities were represented.

“It was helpful to meet up with others who share our concerns,” commented Janette, who selected a workshop introducing Climate and Faith, a seven-week, 40-day devotional resource developed by SALT. Other sessions included a “Wonder and Wander Nature Walk: Mindful Connection” through the trails behind the church, a workshop exploring “earth connection stories” and a creation collage experience.

In welcoming remarks, BTS Center Executive Director the Rev. Allen Ewing-Merrill reminded participants that we are experiencing a \$1 billion dollar weather crisis every three weeks now in the U.S. He also spoke of the unique role that churches can provide in connecting people with the roots of our spiritual traditions and sacredness of all life.

The BTS Center hopes to offer more networking experiences for church green teams in the future. Additionally, the Center’s *“Hope in Small Places: Becoming People of Refugia Faith” Convocation 2024* will be held September 26 - 27 at the Maple Hill Inn in Hallowell and will include an on-line track. The Green Team will host Prayers on the Patio on Sunday morning, July 21, followed by refreshments and conversation.



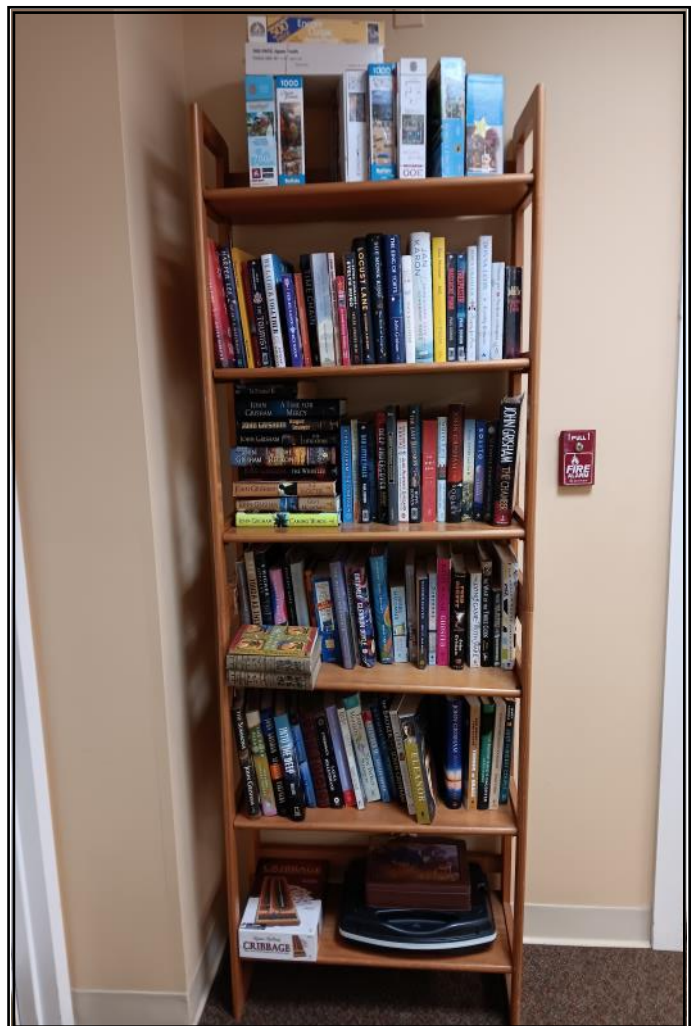
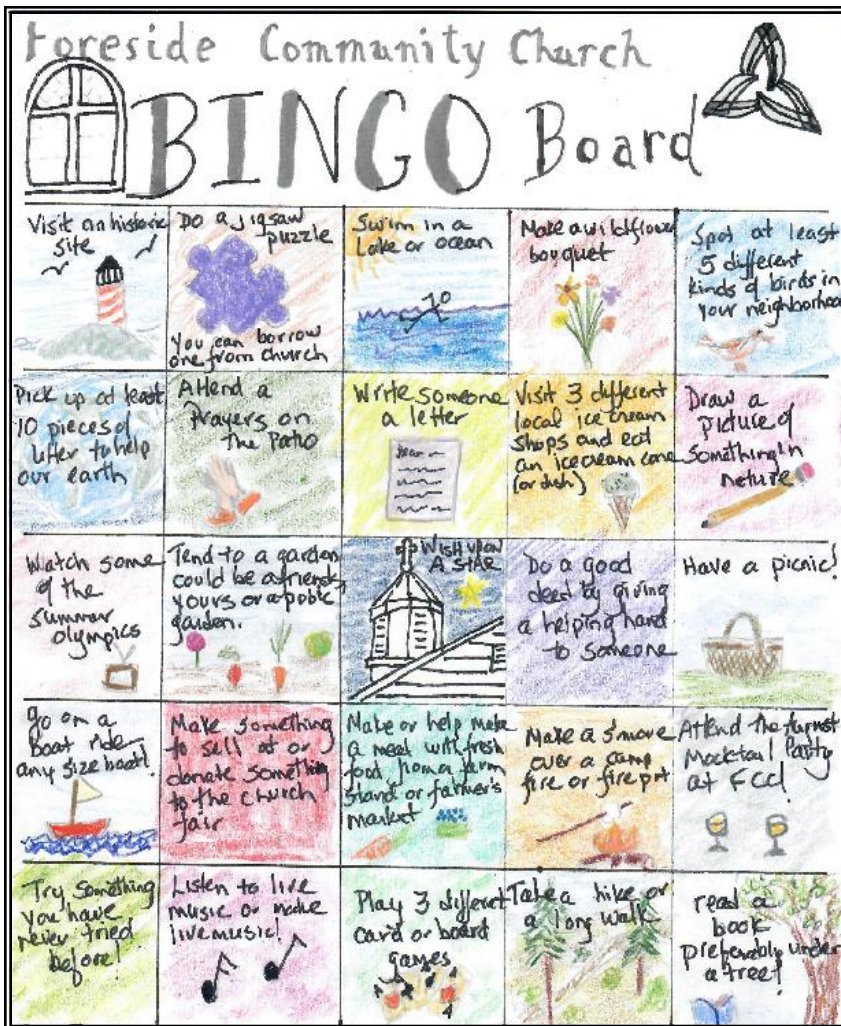

Sister church Congregational Church in Cumberland, UCC and FCC's abutting neighbor Dudley Warner are hard at work this summer soliciting for wood donations for heating needs in our surrounding community. With the tenaciously occurring and tree damaging weather Maine will continue to experience, this is a good time to remind everyone of the ongoing need for donated wood. Cumberland Wood Bank is only one of about a dozen non profit wood collectors located in Maine for Maine citizens. **Finding the story so compelling, the New York Times came to the state to 2021** and wrote a front page article ([which can be read in its entirety by clicking this link](#)) on these efforts. Since 2007, dedicated volunteers at the Cumberland Woodbank have been taking donations of timber and processing wood to keep our neighbors who heat with wood warm. We cut, split, and deliver firewood to those in our community in need of support. We also provide funds for fuel assistance.

Not only does the Cumberland Wood Bank keep people warm, it builds our community and connections. There have been years when about 100 cords have been processed. We are also collaborating with other non-profits, other woodbanks, and the University of Maine to help communities throughout Maine create their own local woodbanks. Currently there are only a handful of woodbanks in Maine.

There is a connection that occurs on the work site with the din of the chainsaws and splitters running. You can't really talk above the machinery while you work so you must be in sync and aware of everyone there. Quickly we all fall into place and split another cord. We come from many different backgrounds but all have one goal in mind – to make sure everyone is warm during a Maine winter.



All this hard work takes a toll on the supplies we have. We are always looking for donations of downed wood. We are happy to talk to you about our work and the possibility of partnering with us.
